

Narayantar Clinic Report

16-18 OCTOBER 2018



OVERVIEW

The Narayan Village Clinic experienced 77 patient presentations ranging from 2yr to 80 yrs . In total 220 medications were dispensed and detailed medical assessments by the WMP team and a Nepalese physician were conducted.

The WMP team consisted of nine USC paramedic students, USC lecturer Belinda Flanagan and WMP team leader and paramedic Mark Ward. The paramedic students conducted an initial vital sign survey, detailed primary and secondary survey and medical history for each patient. The students then were required to give a detailed handover to the supervising physician as well as their recommendations. The physiscian completed the assessment and prescribed appropriate treatment. The students then dispensed the appropriate medications from the pharmacy/treatment area.

All assessments and information given to patients regarding treatment was communicated through the use of interpreters and some students were able to communicate with the patients with some basic Nepalese words. The students worked with the one patient from start to finish.

Health clinic No.2 is being conducted in Pangu, which is an hour and 30min walk from camp. This is a two day clinic from the 19-20/10/18.
